Rodgers Creek	2.6 km ²	4.5 km	0 – 980 m	<i>S slopes of Hollyburn Mountain in Cypress Provincial Park</i>	<i>Burrard Inlet between 28th and 29th Street</i>	<i>Coho, chum and pink salmon and cutthroat trout</i>
Lawson Creek	2.43 km ²	7.5 km	0 – 910 m	<i>Hollyburn Ridge</i>	<i>Burrard Inlet west of John Lawson Park at the foot of 18th Street.</i>	<i>Coho, chum and cutthroat trout</i>
